On the situation at the gate:

Schuster: "So I didn't actually leave until a quarter to 2. I always took the car, so I knew the guards when I came to the gate. I had already seen from afar that there was an incredible number of people outside, because it was very bright in the area there, outside the gate. I say people – as I got closer I could see that it was mainly people with cameras, journalists with cameras and things. They were very densely packed at the gate, pushing up as if to say let us in so we can see what's going on. When I drove up with my car, the guard opened the gate to the outside – it opened outwards, not inwards – and I edged forwards slowly, slowly with my car as the gate opened. He more or less only made this gap for me so that I could drive through with the car. And the people were standing in front of it, but even going slowly the car made them open up a corridor. Everybody tried to talk to me, of course. That was clear to see. Everybody came to the window and wanted to talk to me, to find out what was going on there. But as I said, I wasn't in a position to say anything about what I saw. It wasn't my place and I'm not the type to comment on anything that's not my place."
